UNDISCOVERED



Some persons discover their gifts or talents at a tender age, usually with the help of other people. While for others, it might take a while, and that can happen for many reasons. But the truth remains that we all have something which can be unearthed through our hobbies, interests, recreational activities at school and church, personal experiences, people's testimonies about us, divine ministration, and so on. It is **important** to note that your gifts can be different from those of others, so you don't need to compare. God blessed everyone with unique gifts to meet specific needs, so we can't possibly have the same thing.

UNLEARNED

Discovering your potential is not enough; you need to work towards perfecting it and making it good. 2 Timothy 2:15 (KJV) says, "**Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.**" This stresses the need to learn, practice, and get formal training or professional coaching so that you can be approved as a worthy creative in the hands of God. Many creatives bank on their talent alone and never take the extra step of improving it. And that only leads to mediocrity and abuse, which is far from the excellence God wants us to show.

UNUTILIZED

Now you have the skills and the knowledge, what stops you from utilizing them? Could you be undermining the potential God placed in your hands? Remember the parable of talents in **Matthew 25:14-30**; the first two servants utilized the talents that were given to them, and they got their rewards. But the third servant decided to bury his, and when the master returned, he had nothing to remit, and he was punished. I'm sure you don't want to be that kind of creative who is ungrateful and unfruitful.



You must never forget the personality of the image you were created in. We were created in the image and likeness of God. Therefore, our lives, passions, and work should reflect that image.

Revelation 4:11 (KJV) says, “Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory, honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure, they are and were created.” This means everything God created — everything including ourselves — was created to give pleasure and glory to Him. And that means our lives, bodies, gifts, potential, etc., are glorified instruments.

This also means that our creative abilities are tools for evangelism. Jesus + Health

As followers of Jesus Christ, we hold varying opinions about seeking medical attention. However, despite what we think, Biblical evidence proves that God desires His children to be in perfect health, one of which is 3 John 1:2.

Health, as defined by The World Health Organization (WHO), is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being, and not merely the absence of disease and infirmity. Sickness is an affliction that comes to man through the following ways:

1. **Breaking natural laws:**

Stagnant water bodies are habitats for mosquitoes and other illnesses-causing organisms. They breed well and multiply in an unclean environment. Christian creatives should not take natural laws of rest after work for granted, as the human body is bound to break down after prolonged use. Illness becomes the resultant effect of breaking natural laws.

2. **Satanic affliction:**

When conditions defy medical and scientific remedies, they can be said to be caused by the devil. He uses sin as a yardstick to gain access to and afflict the souls and bodies of men. Sudden outbreaks of chronic illnesses with no previous family records or exposure to risk factors are primarily how the devil afflicts men.

God's desire is for His children to be whole, and so also is the aim of medical science. Medical science does not contradict Faith. Your health comprises mental, social, physical, and spiritual. **Mental health** has to do with how you think, feel and behave. It affects your general output and productivity as a creative. Inadequate mental health affects behaviours, relationships and physical health. Stress and prolonged anxiety disrupt the routine of Christian creatives. **Social health** comprises interpersonal relationships with people around. It also concerns songs, environment, and online/print media that creatives allow into their lives. Good social health improves emotional well-being and interactions. **Physical health**, which is very popular, is concerned with the proper functioning of the body. Your body grows, feels and interacts to the degree of how you allow it. **Spiritual health** is concerned with the inner peace you get with your life. Your daily and frequent interaction with your saviour ascertains spiritual healthiness.

The soundness of your faith and hope in God speaks of your spiritual health. Do not forget that we are the temple of the living God; therefore, you and I must take good care of our bodies. When it comes to staying healthy, the little things usually matter more. Here are some valuable tips:

1. **Eat healthy:**

You are what you eat. Studies have found that the more naturally fresh the food, the more beneficial it is for the body. Avoid processed foods. Take fruits and vegetables regularly. Limit carbonated drinks during work hours and befriend water!

2. **Take adequate rest:**

Avoid prolonged work hours behind the laptop or in the office. Like a machine, you will get signals pointing towards a breakdown. Please pay attention. The eye gets strained from system lights after prolonged hours. Rest your back, and stretch your neck and legs at intervals.



3. Exercise regularly:

Avoid leading a sedentary life. Keep your body moving regularly by taking short walks around your apartment or living area. It keeps your heart in good condition.

4. Build healthy relationships:

This is an advantage for mental health. The Bible rightly says that iron sharpens iron. We should not be in isolation; instead, God designed us to interact with ourselves. Have a circle of friends that you can have healthy conversations with. Many times, that may just be what will deliver you from depression. Do not be a loner.



5. Go for routine medical checks:

While routine checks might be occasional in young people below the age of 40, it is advised to be regular (at least yearly) in persons above the age of 40.

God designed the world to run on two systems: principles and miracles. While we believe healing is the children's bread, we should not defy safety principles and run to God. Principles of drinking water, adhering to proper medication, and taking vaccines where necessary are put there to make life and productivity very effective. No amount of prayers will give you water when you are thirsty. The angel of God commanded the prophet Elijah to arise and eat, for the journey is far. He didn't use anointing or his calling to downplay the importance of food. Paul recognised the therapeutic effects of wine and recommended it to Timothy.




Miracle, on the other hand, is God's intervention in the scheme of things that defies human knowledge. God intervenes when human knowledge is exhausted, not disregarded. Many have exercised faith blindly and ended up in unproductivity. The eye, for instance, gets strained by continual use. Getting a blue-cut lens tailored for work does not mean you do not have faith that God can strengthen your eye.

The above is in no way trying to talk down on faith. As a medical doctor, I pray for the healing of my patients, and I have seen God heal and work miracles through my hands. Yet, what I practice daily is the principle of medicine. When all regulations have been diligently adhered to, and we still encounter illness, it becomes imperative to pray in faith.

If you comply with these basic steps, you will lead a healthier life, your stay on earth will be prolonged, and your relevance will be preserved. I counsel you to continue to build your faith while you do not despise the protocols and principles of well-being.

My earnest desire and prayer are similar to Apostle John's - that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers.




For as long as I can remember, I've always loved to draw and write stories.

*Even while on a missionary journey, the majority of my time is not spent “**doing**” but rather “**spending time with God**”.*

Was there a specific moment when it dawned on you that you had a heavy call from God upon you to be a missionary to the Nations?

I have several defining moments when my call to the Nations became solidified in my heart, but the most striking that comes to my heart right now happened in 2014.

I was travelling that day and suddenly thought of death. I remember God saying to me, "You can't die now; you haven't been to Spain to speak to the people I want you to speak to," and this was at a time in my life when I had never even travelled out of Nigeria. I was a student at Law school with a dream of working at a law firm in Lagos that would pay me a specific amount of money. And here was God talking about Spain? Speaking to people? I didn't understand what it meant, but it marked me!

How has your story (your past), from a sinner to a beloved daughter of God, helped you reach out

I realise that, like the woman at the well (which is a ministry that I lead), my testimony of "come and see a man who knew all things I ever did and still loved and saved me" resonates and brings people to Christ more than any other "theoretical sermon" I can give. There is something about one's life being a testimony to what Jesus can do that brings Jesus near to people and not just as a man in the sky, that says if Jesus can change your life, then He can change mine too.

For Teenagers we reach out to, I see how they can open up to us and share their lives when they see that this Jesus we preach isn't theory; we have lived Him. They open up freely instead of thinking this is an adult selling me a scam. What Jesus has done for me is a door opener for other hearts to see and come and receive what Jesus can also do for them. If He did it for me, He can do it for them too.

You have been a missionary for how many years? Tell us, what have been the challenging and exciting moments for you on this journey?

I've been exploring the globe for the past six years. Indeed, it has presented some challenges. As a missionary, I am not a traveller; rather, I am a moving train for Jesus, redeeming souls from the hand of the fowler, the devil.

I travel alone and without a team, which presents a small additional difficulty, but I have an online intercession team. I am not sent out by any church or missionary organization.

This work has been mostly funded by God Himself, and although it hasn't always been easy, I have seen Him follow through on His promises to bring His word—which He has sent me to proclaim—to pass.

Even if as Christians, nobody enjoys traveling this path without complete trust and faith in God. We would much rather have connections and safety nets than to struggle through and trust in Him to provide for us. It is often difficult to press toward a deeper relationship with God, but the thrill of proving God's faithfulness is priceless and cannot be replaced.


Also, it is lovely to watch my life's journey unfold before my eyes. How is it that God alone unites me with people who are strangers in another country and we get to impact lives for Jesus in various cities throughout the world? In situations where the Lord is the only person I know? How else could these things occur if God wasn't with me? It's exciting to prove God repeatedly and see that He is faithful!

What does a day look like in your life as a missionary? Any surprises or unexpected moments?

A day looks like pressing into God. If you don't like prayer, you cannot be a missionary. We pray for direction, strength and guidance.

We pray and praise for the money to come; we believe in God for the connections; we plan for the meetings or conferences happening; we prepare for the trips; we travel from place to place (my missionary journey isn't stagnant even within nations,) some areas are as far as 12 hours journey within a country.

There are unexpected moments with doors you think may open but doesn't.



Moments of disappointments, weakness and dependence on God. There have also been peaceful moments when I have trusted that God is in control and that everything is working out for the best.

Even though every day is unique while I'm on a missionary journey, I don't have my life planned out because God has called me to this path. It is, above all, a journey of faith.

Often I was only aware of one meeting when I first arrived in the country, God is constantly working on more, and I must spend time getting to know Him personally in order to learn about it.

Therefore, even while on a missionary journey, the majority of my time is not spent "doing" but rather "spending time with God" to get guidance from the one who sent me, after which I can travel to meet the harvest He has sent me to.

What is your greatest arsenal as a missionary to the Nations, and how have you consistently built faith in God for your needs?

Prayer!!! That's it.

During the years of the wilderness, God built me through prayer. I have since learned how much I would need it, even if I wasn't sure at first. My ministry is based in large measure on the altar of prayer. If you take away that aspect of my ministry, I will not be able to continue.

First and foremost, prayer is needed to fortify one's inner strength to persevere, to engage in spiritual combat to conquer the areas to which one is dispatched, to command outcomes even in the face of doubt, to command people's favor, to organize situations, people, and locations even before one arrives. I believe that my greatest tool for winning over the world to Christ is prayer.

When I reflect on my life's journey, I see that God did not establish my faith in the mission field; rather, it began in 2013 when I was a university student and had to trust God for a 2:1 grade when it seemed impossible. Later, in 2016, I believed in God for financial support for ministry work in Lagos, transportation expenses to get from one place to another in Lagos, and money to print my books, among other things. God began His great work of faith in me with little things, and now He has begun bigger things in me, like trusting Him for the Nations. My relationship with God and our journey together have given me confidence knowing He does not fail.

Were your parents and loved ones supportive of the call of God on you? You are a woman; how did you deal with the many stereotypes around this gender?

During my early years in ministry, it was difficult for me to get along with my parents and to share my experience with them. In the beginning, I felt like an embarrassment to them. I also experienced unusual feelings because nobody in my family had any idea what God was doing with me. "You are a lawyer; go practice law," they declared.

However, God had other ideas for me, and I had to start by obeying Him regardless of what other people thought of me. During a moment of tension with my parents, God posed the following scriptural question to me: Acts 4:19 KJV - But Peter and John answered and said unto them, **Whether it be right in the sight of God to hearken unto you more than unto God, judge ye.**

God asked me to decide for myself whom I would obey. I did, I chose to obey Him. Years later, everyone has followed my decision to follow God.

The stereotype that I encountered as a woman on this journey was that of mocking comments and feelings of inadequacy, even in myself.

Before I began visiting other countries, I seem to recall someone telling my sister, then I was travelling within Nigeria. She went on to say "this your sister that doesn't stay home, how would she find a husband?" Because in some way, being at home made it easier for guys to find you for a marriage.

Among my own deficiencies was the idea of finding & marrying a man who would acknowledge my calling. I used to struggle a lot with this, but I've come to realize that everything is found in Jesus over time. He has the appropriate individual for the call, since He gave me the call. He's wise, and all of it is found in Him.

I also heard what He said. The reality of what God is saying to me and His identity for my life have engulfed my shortcomings. This is all that grounds me, and it doesn't matter if someone else defends the ideal of what a woman ought to be or is. All I want is to hear and fulfill the calling God has placed on my life. That is what counts.



What do you believe and you're fully aware of are some of the challenges missionaries face, and how can they overcome them?

Missionaries typically feel alone. Many obstacles would have been overcome if one could get through this by being so content and confident in God. One constant is the internal battle of "Is God with me" during difficult times. Since you see the incredible things God is doing while you travel, the desire to "belong" can also be complicated for missionaries who are single like me. The feeling that "I don't have a home" can be crippling, and if you are not confident that Christ is your home no matter where you go, that can be a real struggle.

The foundation of a missionary must be Christ. It is essential to maintain a strong foundation and identity in Christ that will follow you wherever you go and whatever task you take on.

You can overcome this obstacle by becoming fully involved in the community and asking God to bring you into your tribe. Being with people who don't understand you can be lonely, but when God brings you your tribe, it feels like home. This has been accomplished for us by God.

Another issue that may arise is money. This can be overcome by placing complete trust in God and following His instructions. God is faithful and trustworthy, and He has wisdom for us in carrying out the vision He has given us. Try not to be concerned; instead, trust God and ask for guidance on what to do. Use spiritual principles of praise, prayer, and commanding resources as well, because the devil opposes the release of funds for God's kingdom, but we always triumph with God, who owns it all and distributes it to whomever He pleases! Amen.

You have ministered to several souls, even those outside the Christian faith; what has helped you reach out to them?

Like the Apostle Paul, I become all things to all men so we can by all means win all for Christ. A missionary sent out goes with Jesus' love for souls. You must see, speak, and reach out with the Love of Jesus, which cuts across divides and demographics. The command is GO. GO to those Jesus sends and leads you to with loving eyes and hearts.

What are some of God's major and minor achievements through you, and how did they make you feel?

To be honest, I go because I love Jesus. I'm not sure what I do for Christ qualifies as an accomplishment. I'm just delighted and grateful that I obeyed, and that the Holy Spirit held and carried me through as Jesus worked through me.



How do you prepare for your mission trips? Are they spontaneous or gradually planned, especially in a new country with language barriers?

A trip can take months to plan. Travelling is only one aspect of it. When God announces or places a new nation in my heart, I begin by praying, fasting, and building spiritual capacity for the new. Only after we have won the battle and gained authority in the secret place do we come out to announce or raise funds/look for connections/do all the things we appear to do in public. The majority of the work is done in God's secret place.

Language barriers can be frustrating, to say the least, especially when the country's primary language is not mixed with English. Plus, I get disoriented when I walk into a new city and feel like a stranger. But God always speaks to me through **Psalm 24**. My Father owns the world, and I am not a stranger wherever He sends me.

So I'd say that I hear God's word as I go, and perhaps there is a grace for feeling at home with men of a different tongue and language, even if I don't speak the language. We preach through interpreters and communicate with love across barriers.

Also, if one spends so much time in a place, learning the language helps.

In what way has your creative gift helped you in your missionary journey?

Wow. Writing has been an absolute blessing in my life calling!

It's worth noting that my calling is to be "a voice to the Nations." Being a missionary and physically stepping foot in those nations is one way I fulfil my life calling. Another powerful tool that God employs is the written word and media. My writings. My books. Social Media. My blog and my YouTube channel. God uses all this to speak to the world's nations through me. There appears to be a grace for Hephzibah's books to be carried to the nations of the earth for God's glory.

My coordinator in Tanzania discovered me after reading my book, and so did my host in Kenya. Meetings we've had worldwide have resulted in my books reaching and touching lives, as well as raising funds for the work.

I am highly grateful for the work because the way God has wired us is to fulfil His call on our lives. I thank God for the grace of my spoken and written words. It has been a blessing!

What are your thoughts on witnessing to souls and your biggest advice for anyone considering to be a missionary?


Every soul, I believe, should be seen through the eyes of love for and from Jesus. God does not follow the crowd; every soul is precious to Him. See the souls you witness with the love and eyes of Jesus. That He would send you across nations to touch a soul. Oh, the Father's Love.

My best advice to anyone considering becoming a missionary is to invest the time required to develop a strong relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. You must go deep in Christ because what is needed is great capacity, depth, character strength, and grace, which can only be found in Christ. Consider Mark 3:15-17

Your being with Jesus is first; the calling to GO is next. Focus on the first, and the rest becomes easier.

When is your next mission outreach, and how can readers be of help to the beautiful things God is doing through you?

Depending on when you are reading this, I am currently transiting out of Kenya and into a new country. By God's grace, I will be moving to the next nation in the last week of October 2023, and we also have other nations to do



and finish between November and the first quarter of 2024 that we need God's help with.

As a missionary, you can help us in two ways: you can be an intercessor who prays for me and the work; we have an intercessory team of people who are committed to pushing me and the work forward in prayer even if they aren't in the field with me. I can't tell you how many times this has saved my life. Yes. I've also been in accidents and been sick, but God has always saved me through the prayers of His saints.



THE VISION + IMPACT OF KINGDOM BUILDERS INTERNATIONAL

In January 2021, the Lord instructed us to reach out to secondary school students in Nigeria and raise them as the driving force of His end-time revival. So we started with a “bulldozer faith” and trained about 50 teenagers who attended 12 schools in the city of Ibadan. There were many lessons, testimonies, and challenges, but we successfully had a 19-week training at two (2) different centres concurrently. This was our very first attempt, and we considered it a success.

In two years, we have gone deeper into the city and other cities, having held more than 120 in-school training sessions across 57 secondary schools in Ibadan, Ikire, Ile-Ife, Ile-Oluji, Owo, and Akure. Over 10,000 teenagers have been directly imparted through these in-school outreaches. This platform is just one of the different platforms that God has given us to reach and raise teenagers for the advancement of His kingdom.

A CHARGE TO THOSE CALLED TO THE YOUTH MINISTRY

If you are under 30 and called to the ministry, you should pay your most committed attention to people younger than 17. Why? Our median age is 17. This means that if you divide Nigeria’s population into two halves, one half is younger than 17 years old. (In Africa, the median age is 18.8). Our goal in this article is to challenge, inspire, and instruct every reader who shares this same burden to advance God’s Kingdom on some essential things. We will outline these crucial success keys in simple words.



01

VISION: The inner picture of God’s purpose and your role in it will determine the direction and destination of your life and team. As a founder, people will follow you primarily because of your vision. As a co-labourer, your vision and clarity will determine the field in which you labour.

02

CONVICTION: Stay faithful to your vision. Stick to the plan. Give no room for compromise because it is easy to slip from kingdom advancement into mere social work. Your conviction will fuel your consistency and persistence, which will eventually birth greatness.

03

PEOPLE: Cherish and honour the people God has given you; this will help you maximise your relationships. Without vision, the people perish; without people, the vision suffers.

04

REST: Do not misuse your strength. Commit to the “No burnout” rule for you and your team members. Rest well. Cherish and spend time with your family. The key is to mix the youth’s strength and the elders’ wisdom. Implement delegation, schedules, and routines for effective time management.

05

EXCELLENCE: Determine and commit to doing everything at your highest possible best. Excellence attracts the right people to you and opens significant doors for you.

06

SYSTEMS AND STRUCTURES: Implementing systems and structures early on ensures efficient resource utilization, predictability, and consistent success. It protects against human limitations and ensures growth. Waiting to grow before implementing them may limit your impact.

07

FAITH: Be audacious to reach out to whosoever God has revealed to you. The greater the faith, the deeper the work that must be done in your heart. Give yourself an understanding of how faith works, and practise it. God creates things by faith. We build great things, do the impossible, and operate the supernatural by faith.

08

LOVE: You cannot remain offended by those you were sent unto. You cannot also look at them defectively. Even if you start with only one person, treat that person like a thousand. Likewise, love those God sent to labour with you, and let them know.

09

CONTINUOUS LEARNING is crucial for ministry success. Obtain relevant training resources and review them with your team. The strategy and operations teams must continuously grow in line with your assignment.

10

DATA IS KING: It is crucial for effective decision-making and system refinement. It's essential to take records and reports seriously, learn from them, and use insights for optimization and correction in the future.

11

Do the **IMPORTANT**, not the impressive. Guide your decision-making process by asking if what you are embarking on is essential to the vision or unique to people. Focus on the important things; you will end up impressing many people this way.

12

ABSOLUTE SOURCE: Let God be your total source. Be led ALWAYS by the Holy Spirit. When you rely on God, you will learn that "the miracle is in the house" but only temporarily hidden from your mind. Your Moses' rod, five loaves, and your little jar of oil are all waiting to be God's tools of miracles.





The essence of
DISCIPLESHIP

WHO IS A DISCIPLE?

UPON HIS RESURRECTION, the Lord Jesus Christ handed down several instructions to the early believers, which we today know as the pillars of Christianity. These pillars are the foundation on which God's kingdom is established. In the accounts of Mathew 28:18-20 and Mark 16:15-20, the disciples of Christ, who were eyewitnesses of all Christ did here on earth, were responsible for declaring those events to the world's nations. In what many theologians have regarded as the great commission, Christ charged His disciples and many who will after that believe in Him, to go into the world and preach the gospel to every creature, teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you.

Christ knew the peculiarity of their terrain and gave His disciples the **POWER** to engage and effectively preach the gospel in that age. With this authority and power, the disciples were expected to make disciples of all nations.

One who serves as a student under a teacher or master, to be schooled along a particular way of life, is best described as a disciple. Discipleship shows the readiness and submission of the student to the master for learning and the willingness of the teacher to impart knowledge to the student. There is an agreement to learn together in a particular method or way. Prophet Amos rightly stated, "Can two walk together, except they are agreed?"

Discipleship is said to have been prevalent in the life and times of ancient Greek thinkers like Socrates, Plato and Aristotle. In Christianity, discipleship is a sequel to salvation. Effective Christian growth is measured in the level of unlearning, learning and re-learning undergone by new converts. At redemption, a recent convert is likened to a newborn babe sincerely desiring the milk of God's word to grow. The level of training determines, to a great extent, the effectiveness one will have in God's kingdom.

ESSENCE OF DISCIPLESHIP FOR CHRISTIAN CREATIVES.

Elisha became the next prophet in Israel after careful study and due diligence under the prophetic ministry of Elijah. Samuel had no one to understudy his prophetic ministry, which led King Saul to the witch at Endor to enquire about using witchcraft. Discipleship helps to bridge the gap when a leader, tutor, prophet, king, pastor, etc, receives his call from the Lord to return home. Elisha died with his anointing and found no one willing to understudy his prophetic ministry. It, therefore, shows the great importance of having disciples and training them to maturity.



STEPS TO ACHIEVE PROPER DISCIPLESHIP

Teaching is the best and most effective way to make disciples. The following scriptures will help to bolster this point: Matthew 28:18-20, Acts 1:3, Acts 1:1, Acts 20:20. Christ, our perfect example, spent 40 days after His resurrection teaching the disciples the things that pertain to the kingdom of God. He gave quality time to ensure they were well-rooted in the doctrines before embarking on their journey of making disciples of all nations. Apostle Paul gave himself to teaching and had effective and sound leadership in the gentile churches he planted.

These and many more are the patterns Christ employs in teaching His disciples. He cared for them, taught them, and sent them on errands to put to practice twice what He taught. He also exposed them to new experiences like that of the mount of transfiguration. He taught them to emulate His life's patterns as their mentor and teacher. He publicly told them to "avoid the leaven of the Pharisees." He didn't keep the knowledge they required from them to survive in a troublesome world.

To take discipleship seriously as Christ commands means to take teaching of the Word paramount, as much as living the Word. Actions, they say, speak louder than words. Biblical activities and dispositions in line with the consistent study of the Word make for a wholesome discipleship period, thereby enriching and boldening the body of Christ.

Mr. Favour and Mrs. Chioma Olise are a young Christian couple separated for seven (7) years after two years of marriage and the birth of their first child. But God had other plans; they miraculously found their way back to each other, and their love story has been filled with happiness and inspiration since their reconciliation.

Can we know you? Tell us a brief story on how you met?

FAVOUR: My name is Olise Favour, from Delta State. I met my wife in Port Harcourt while working as an MTN contractor, maintaining MTN masks. Fortunately, there was an MTN mask in the compound behind where my wife lived. I used to go there with my colleagues, but I had never seen her. One day, I was there working when she came home and met me. We talked, and I felt at peace. I took her contact information, and that was the beginning of our relationship.

CHIOMA: I am Chioma Olise from Abonnema, Rivers State. I met my husband on June 7th, 2012, just as he had stated. One evening, after returning from work, I noticed movement in our backyard, and I went to check who it was and then met him. We started our journey to courtship and were married on December 15, 2012.

Separation is different from divorce; the period of staying away from one another, how was it, and how did you know you would get back together?

FAVOUR: To add to what she said, I loved being happy and myself. Then I got married, and I never thought there would be misunderstandings because we were raised in different homes. We needed God's grace to carry on, but I left because I thought I would be happier. Some people, just like us, have terrible marriages, yet marriage remains the best institution on earth only if you understand what it means. I left because I didn't understand, and I don't think she did either. We didn't understand each other, so we had problems.

I never thought that we would get back together. I tried to run far away, but God kept bringing me closer to her. My friend called me one day and told me he saw my wife holding a Bible. She had forgotten something in the house and dropped her Bible to get it. He saw my picture inside the Bible, and to him, my wife was praying for my return. I told him to forget about it, and it wouldn't work because I was not God.

CHIOMA: It was not a pleasant journey, but I thank God for the experience. I wouldn't wish it on anyone. They say experience is the best teacher, but I'd rather advise people to learn from others' mistakes than make their own. Before I married, I used to discuss with my friends what I wanted in a husband. I said I wouldn't marry a man who would give me headaches and that I'd divorce him if he did. As if the devil heard me, I started having problems with my husband after the first year of marriage. I tried to ignore them, but I couldn't. I wanted to leave.

Whenever I thought about leaving, I worried about what people and my family would say. So I stayed. But the more I visited, the more problems we had. Eventually, my husband left. And when that happened, life became tough; it was a terrible experience, and I hope others can learn from my mistakes because it is not a good story to tell.

FAVOUR: God showed me why He was God and even started the business that brought me back. While I was in Delta State, there was an issue in Kano that demanded my attention, and honestly, I didn't know I would meet the people I met when I got there. My eldest brother, especially, who had come to Kano from the East, I didn't know he was around. I didn't think I would meet her there either. I wouldn't have come if I knew. I tried to focus on what brought me here, but eventually, the problem with my wife came up. How my brother and others presented the issue weakened me and made me realise that the business that brought me was not so serious. So, our marital problem became a serious one. When I tried to walk away, I discovered all the doors had closed against me. I had no choice but to listen to the voice of reasoning.

What were your first thoughts on reuniting, did you ever have the fear of making the same mistake again?

FAVOUR: The same mistake again? No. I took away the fear. Fear is a torment. If you allow fear to come into you, what happened before will happen again. So what I decided to do when we got back together was to keep the mistakes that would come from her behind me, swallow, tolerate, endure, and be patient. I discovered that now I am enjoying her better than when we first got married because I choose not to shout or see the mistakes; I decide not to see the faults but to see her as who she is and help her work on her weaknesses. The one I couldn't work on, I take it up like that. Add some ingredients when you are hungry and put water on fire to cook soup. Sometimes, you may overadd salt, and you won't say that because it is salty, you throw the soup away; you simply see how you can manage the soup to satiate your hunger. I decided to put my fears away and then move on.

CHIOMA: One of the reasons our marriage broke down the first time was sex. I don't like sex, but my husband does. Sometimes, when he asked for it, I would complain to avoid it. This was a big mistake. I learned that sex is part of the marriage contract. It's not just something that I signed; it's also something that God ordained to be part of the relationship between man and woman. So it's something I have to do. Since our separation, I've learned to do this, and things are better now. Another reason for our separation was my husband's constant complaints. My husband would complain about everything I did. "Don't do this; don't do that." Now, I avoid what he complains about to avoid misunderstandings.

CHIOMA: Well, I had no fear. I decided to move forward and face any challenges that may come while ensuring that I made the right decisions and made the proper switch at all times. And those things that caused those problems at the initial time, I try to avoid them so that things will not be the same again.

My first thought on reuniting was that I had prayed and hoped for God's will, and when it came, all I could do was give God the glory for making everything come to pass.

What led to the separation? And has it strengthened your relationship now that you're together again?

FAVOUR: As I said earlier, we separated because we didn't understand each other. Like the teeth and the tongue, we were created to work together, but sometimes, out of anger or mistake, the teeth bite the tongue. The tongue never leaves its position and never says to the teeth, "I'm not going to help you anymore."

The first reason we separated was a need for more understanding. I couldn't understand why my wife didn't always do things as I wanted her to. For example, let it be there whenever I want anything to be here. When you push it up to another place, I get angry. Last year, when couples got together during the men's programme, the women were asked what made their husbands angry. For me, it is when my house is not kept in order.

But now, I understand that my wife is my helpmate, and I am her support. Whenever she is tired while doing those things, I need to help her. Before, I wouldn't do this, but now I do it happily. My wife doesn't like washing clothes or cooking, but I do. So these are the areas where she fell short, and I have the grace to fill them up. It helps us move forward faster and better.

The changes that come with reuniting again, how did you handle them?

FAVOUR: Because our marriage was divinely ordained, I never felt I was missing out on anything by returning to her. If you want to swim, you have first to overcome your fears.

CHIOMA: When we got back together, I was hesitant at first. I was uneasy about doing anything that might make him angry or upset. But after a few months, I realized that he had changed. He was no longer the same person he used to be. So, I opened up and let go of my fears. Since then, our journey has been smooth. We haven't had any major arguments, even the small, everyday ones. We are grateful to God for his mercy.

What are the practical things wanna-be couples should prepare for in marriage?

FAVOUR: One of the most essential things in marriage is sex. Be ready to go all in on it for your partner. As my wife had once stated, she is not a very sexual person, whereas I am. We make compromises for each other for everything to work out. Another important thing is not to stay angry overnight. The offence will surely come, but try as much as possible to settle it before the next day. The easiest way to do this is to be ready to communicate and forgive each other.

What are the little things you do for fun and one another to sustain the spark in your marriage?

FAVOUR: Maintaining an active, intimate life is one of the things we do to keep our marriage exciting. I often playfully spank her bum when she walks by. I made her understand that whenever such things happen, it shows that I am at peace with you. I can spontaneously approach her, play with her, and share kisses, all as a sign of our peacefulness. If, at any point, I no longer acknowledge her passing by, it may suggest that there is a problem. Therefore, keeping the element of play and constant interaction is essential to ensure a healthy and fun marriage.

CHIOMA: In addition to what my husband said, once in a while, he buys me things; those are also things that have helped in spicing up our marriage.

CHIOMA: The most important thing for couples to do before getting married is to be honest with themselves. If you're not honest, you'll start to show your true colours after marriage, and your partner will see them. This can lead to problems. So if you don't like something,

tell your partner. Be clear and upfront. This way, when they start showing things you don't like, you can remind them of what you said earlier. And you can both work on it together.

What was the place of God and family members in bringing you back together?

FAVOUR: I never wanted to see my wife again. But because she prayed for me, God's place came from her end. Despite my complaints and stories, my family refused to let me move on with another woman. They insisted that I return to her. I tried to date another woman, but they forbade it, and I never wanted to do anything without their permission. I decided to stay alone when I saw that they were not listening to me.


CHIOMA: First and foremost, I want to thank the widows of the Assemblies of God church in Umuoko Alor, Port Harcourt, for their support. When my husband left, I prayed but eventually stopped. People told me not to be concerned, so I went to these widows and offered them money as a sacrifice. "I am neither a widow nor a divorcee," I would tell them, "but all I need is your prayers," and they would pray for me.

I'd like to thank Elder Nnanna in Kano. He's a man I'll never forget. Despite the rumors and gossip, he stood by me. Even to this day, he has not changed. Rev. Dr. Victor Amanwandi, my reverend, was one of God's tools in keeping me in Kano. Seven years is a long time, and it is not something you can sleep through. He was the one who kept encouraging me to stay in Kano State when I finally decided to leave. "You will not leave in my time," he'd say. You can do that after I go." To God be the glory, this settlement occurred in his time and in a way we did not anticipate. I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to him. In 2020, God used him to perform a miracle in my life and my family's lives, which I will never forget.

What advice would you give yourself before getting married?

CHIOMA: The advice I'd give myself back then is to pray well before getting married. Secondly, be mindful of the things I say. There are so many negative things I said as a single lady years ago that manifested when I got married that I had to ask God for forgiveness. I advise anyone reading this testimony to watch their words and pronouncements. Not all wishes come true, and the devil may hear some of the negative words you speak and work with them. **Prayer is the most important thing I wish I had done** because I can't honestly say I did. Even when I was called because of this marriage by the church board, they asked me if I had prayed, and I said that I hadn't but that I was going by faith. I **went on my own**, and when challenges came, I didn't hesitate to return to God and ask for forgiveness and mercy. Indeed, God answered and showed mercy. I thereby advise young singles to pray before making any choice.

FAVOUR: As my wife said, one of the worst things in life to say is, 'If only I had known'. To avoid this, you need to put God first. It is said that 'women are like parcels; anyone you take home, you take whatever you see inside'. So, it is up to men to work with whatever they get. We often make good wishes, but when we find ourselves at the other end of life and are unprepared for it, we begin to have difficulties. When planning for the future, plan for progress while also considering what can go wrong. What are your options? I only had Plan A because I never had a backup plan. That is why it had such an impact on me. Having a backup plan is a good idea for everyone planning to marry. If things do not go as planned, you must be able to reverse direction and approach the situation differently. Those are the best advice I could give myself before marriage and anyone considering getting married.

CHIOMA: Back home, after you've married, **there's no such thing as a second marriage**. You must persevere, work on your marriage, and pray. 



CALLING & CAREER

The question of what your calling or purpose is and how it matches with your career choice is a very relatable one. For some time, I struggled as a creative and medical scientist, asking myself, “Can I fulfil my calling, or do I change my course of study during my postgraduate studies?”

From a Biblical perspective, the concept of career and calling is tied to fulfilling one’s God-given purpose and using one’s skills and talents to serve others. The Bible emphasizes the idea of working diligently and with integrity. The Bible says, “Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as though you were working for the Lord and not for people” [Colossians 3:23 GNT]. Career and calling can be used interchangeably, but “calling” is more often associated with a sense of vocation or purpose that aligns with God’s plan for an individual’s life (which is the same thing as your career, e.g. ministerial work is a career as people can also grow in the work of the ministry while photography can be someone else’s calling and career). Proverbs 16:3 says, “Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish you...” Most Christians make the mistake of trying to separate the two because they feel “calling” is from God while “career” is ONLY a way to build a professional profile.



The Bible says, “God directs the steps of the godly”. In every phase of life you are (church directly or professional), the important question is: Are you using that position to spread the gospel of love? And is Christ evident in your daily life and tasks? My life has always followed the mantra of Psalms 16:6, which says, “Lines are fallen unto me in pleasant places”, and when I discovered my gift of writing and the calling to create visual content much later, I knew there was a big picture God was preparing me to fit in. You may be reading this and can reflect on how you thought you liked to write and that that was your calling, but a few months later, you were led to start a podcast, and things are now more confusing than before. So, what, then, is your purpose? Better put, what is God’s purpose for you?

“Purpose” is what you do that makes God glorified. Your life is the first content, even before the content you create. Here are Biblical and Contemporary proofs both in ancient and recent times:


MOSES was a shepherd by career. His staff/mantle was the tool God used to part the Red Sea and perform many signs and wonders. His purpose for that calling was to lead the children of Israel to the promised land and get them there safely.

ABOLAJI ADEOLA is the Lead Pastor of RCCG Living Seed Church. Beyond the fact that he is a certified Google digital marketing expert and a Certified Project Management Professional, he is currently the Head of Digital Communications in the Office of the Principal Executive Assistant to the General Overseer and has used this tool to project God’s purpose for his life - reaching out to nations through the gospel.

PAUL, a Lawyer by profession/career, used tent-making, oratory gifts, and writing skills to achieve God’s purpose for him to evangelize the Gentile world.

JOSEPH was a household superintendent both for Potiphar and eventually for Pharaoh. That could be said to be his career because he found himself doing it at different levels and did it well. Meanwhile, God gave him the gifts of dream interpretations and leadership skills to achieve his purpose for being in that career. Consequently, he saved up enough grains for the period of famine in Egypt, thereby saving the Egyptians, his family, and surrounding nations through the famine.

DANIEL was a Jewish scholar and master interpreter of dreams. He used his wisdom and gift of visions and interpretation of dreams to save lives, serve Babylonian kings, and fulfil God’s purpose for sending Him to Babylon.



YOUR CAREER, GIFT, OR TALENTS ARE THE MANTLES IN YOUR HAND THAT WILL:

- ◇ place you on a pedestal that will make people listen when you speak;
- ◇ expose you to more people and more opportunities to share the gospel;
- ◇ be an avenue to impact your generation by contributing to humanity via your field, etc.

Therefore, the skills you acquire during training teach you to think, sharpen your mind, discipline you, and help you to overcome the obstacles that come your way. Your career is a tool for outreach by God, which should be taken seriously.

Who then is a Christian CREATIVE ?

Christian Creatives are God's PROs (Public Relations Officers) on earth. They act in various capacities like Literature Evangelists, Visual Content Creators including (but not limited to) YouTubers, Filmmakers, TikTokers, Audio Content Creators including songwriters, song cover makers, podcasters, etc. The list is endless. The importance of storytelling and record keeping can be seen in the case of the Bible events and happenings that were recorded and handed down through generations. Christians today can easily read and apprehend God's promises, admonitions, and commandments through the Bible.



It is also worthy of note that New Testament pillars penned scriptural truths that align with the prophecies spoken about in the Old Testament. The testament of Christ's birth in the four gospels aligns with the prophecies made by Prophets Isaiah and Jeremiah. Christian Creatives should desist from all forms of heresy and negative contents that divide the body of Christ and do not edify the bride of Christ.

While we have established that your calling can be independent of your career, acquiring relevant skills to better your calling is also important. Putting the work where necessary is not enough to have a calling. 2 Samuel 24:24 emphasizes that "you cannot give to God what does not cost you something". Take your calling, talents, and gifts to another level. For a creative who is called into content writing and creation, taking up courses in copywriting, script writing, effective podcasting, etc, will be an added advantage. Know how to influence and maximize social media algorithms for efficiently propagating your content to its target audience.

Furthermore, while it is necessary to pursue excellence, start where you are. The most frequent excuse these days is "There are too many people doing that already", but the Bible says the harvest is plenty and the labourers are few. So, who are you to say there are enough labourers already? (Matthew 9:37-38).





As an entrepreneur, the gospel in the marketplace is as important as channelling your calling wherever you are. You can showcase God through your business. What confuses people is that they believe and think that preaching must be done from the pulpit or even through created contents; they tend to forget that as Christians, it is paramount that others see Jesus in your everyday life, irrespective of where you find yourself, as a politician or as an accountant. You are the Bible that men will read.

To fulfil the gospel of reconciliation given to us all, whether as a creative or not, you are a creation that should glorify your Creator. Needless to say, wealth will attract sinners to the gospel. You can serve God with wealth, so we must be found as Christians in the marketplace, making policies that will favour the propagation of the gospel.

It is also important to reiterate that as a media evangelist, there are divisions to ministry, and even as 'small' as sharing godly content is recognizable in the Bible just as we have, Paul planted, Apollos watered; great were the number of them called. God needs the company of many to reach others, as we have in Psalm 68:11. Be a Barnabas and win them one by one - Daniel 12:3.

The need for **kingdom financiers** cannot be overemphasized. The gospel media ministry is a money-sapping ministry. The edge the entertainment industry has is the ability to apply for sponsorships and partnerships with brands, investors, etc, but rarely do we have the church to support this ministry. We need children of God to rise up and donate funds for literature evangelism, gospel film shows, outreaches, making of gospel movies, etc. Hence, they need to be professionally useful and relevant.

In conclusion, there is no feat without a challenge, and while I may not outline them here, we know that we are overcomers in Christ. In times of confusion, receive clarity from the Scriptures and counsel from those ahead.
